Personal Social & Emotional Development

Independence is encouraged in many ways e.g., children putting away their belongings either on their peg or in their draw when entering the classroom. Language and actions are modelled to make friends and becoming familiar with our school values.

Literacy

Phonics (Phase 2) is taught daily alongside forming the focus letter correctly. Writing when names are recognised, the focus moves to forming the letters in our names correctly. The stories we will enjoy this term focus on families and autumn, and we will discover and discuss that print has meaning alongside how to handle books respectfully.

Understanding the World

We will be going for a walk to note the key features of our rural environment in preparation to discuss the differences and similarities of a town. Autumn also gives us the opportunity to be out in our community collecting treasures from the changing season.

Communication and Language

Physical Development

Maths
